1963: South Carolina's Year of Decision - Part 2: Desegregating the University of South Carolina by Dr. Ron Cox



In January 1963, South Carolina's rigid system of racial segregation in higher education ended when Harvey Gantt enrolled peacefully at Clemson College. But opposition to racial change remained high and it was by no means certain that the pattern of non-violent compliance would be repeated at the state's other colleges and universities. This talk will examine how the University of South Carolina handled the delicate issue of desegregation in light of national, regional, and local events.
